## **SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES AND INTERESTS**

Since 1977, I have performed diagnostic psychological testing and behavioral treatment planning, concentrating on children with developmental disabilities including autism. As a certified school psychologist, I have helped intellectually and emotionally challenged children to achieve greater success in school.
